**Kiŋ-**the

**dena-**these

**tuwe-**who

**Yuta-**(s)he eats

**Slide Three:** Ćaŋ kiŋ de tuwe wayaŋka he? Who has seen this tree?

**Ćaŋ-**tree

**kiŋ-**the

**de-**this

**tuwe-**who

**wayaŋka-**(s)he sees

**he-**word put at the end of a question

**Slide Four:** Wiċata nuŋpa ded tipi. Two raccoon live here.

**wiċata-**Raccoon

**nuŋpa-**two

**ded-**here

**tipi-**live
